INFOGRAPHIC REPORT: COVID-19 EFFECTS ON ACADEMIC LIFE


SURVEY METHODS

During the summer of 2020, an online survey was administered to graduate students who had received Basic Needs services at seven University of California campuses. Respondents reported COVID-19 exposures and infections, COVID-19 impacts on work, basic needs (food and housing) and academics, and campus Basic Needs service utilization. The following infographics pertain to COVID-19 impacts on graduate students' academic lives.



SHELTER-IN-PLACE/SOCIAL DISTANCING

77% of students following orders to a **great extent**

18% of students are/were living with someone who was not following orders

INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT: RESPONDING TO COVID-19

STUDENT CONCERNS: EFFECTS OF COVID-19

TOP 5: LEARNING

- 74% Learning effectively in the remote instruction environment
- 71% Ability to conduct research
- 65% Having access to an appropriate study space
- 58% Interacting with faculty outside of class
- 53% Having access to library resources and services

TOP 4: GENERAL

- 78% Being isolated from friends
- 74% Being isolated from faculty, mentors, and/or advisors
- 71% Not getting a job after graduation
- 60% Accessing healthcare

REMOTE LEARNING EXPENSES

50% OF STUDENTS REPORTED ACADEMIC EXPENSES, TO CONTINUE STUDYING FROM HOME (N=399)

ENROLLMENT STATUS

98% of students reported **no change in enrollment status** due to COVID-19


86% of students **planned to enroll** in Fall 2020 quarter

Top reasons why **114** students did not plan to enroll or were unsure

- 61% Plan to graduate by Fall 2020
- 14% Financial challenges
- 9% Have concluded coursework
- 8% Health concerns

IMPACT ON ONLINE TEACHING ABILITIES

48% of educators were impacted by lack of reliable computers, internet connection, and/or other technological needs
